It in turn requires efforts to understand and maximize international cooperation and support without unduly compromising national security interests.

The Symposium is aimed at not only bringing in the views of experts but also at disseminating it for the betterment of the existing responsibility that every citizen undertakes for the betterment of the society. The knowledge of various experts specialized in this area would set a benchmark for the improvement that still needs to be done to improve the existing scenario. The Symposium will facilitate the sharing of experiences of the Academia, Government, Nongovernment Organizations, Advocates, Researchers and learners with each other.
