- 1. 8th National Moot Court Competition by CMR University (School of Legal Studies, Bengaluru):** Organized by CMR University, Bengaluru from 19th May 2022 to 22nd May 2022.

Ms. Anushka Singhal, Mr. Priyam Tiwari and Ms. Kavana Rao, Second Year Learners participated in the competition and qualified for the '**Quarter Finals**' round of the competition. Ms. Kavana Rao was adjudged the '**Best Researcher**' and was awarded with a prize money of Rs. 10,000.

20 teams from all over India participated in the competition and after Two Preliminary rounds, only 8 teams qualified for the Quarter Finals. The problem of the competition was based on the Credit Information Companies (Regulation) Act, 2005. The moot problem revolved around the issue of violation of privacy by this act and also dealt upon the importance of the credit score to assess one's credit worthiness.
