Students who have appeared for their H.S.C finals and awaiting results are also eligible to apply, subject to submission of passing certificate by the announced date.

Applicants who have obtained 10+2 through Open Universities system directly without having any basic qualification are not eligible for the Law Course.

Age Limit: Candidate should be <u>less than 20</u> <u>years of age</u> at the time of appearing for SET as on 04 May 2013. (2 years relaxation for SC/ST candidates i.e. 22 years)

11. ASSESSMENT All internal courses will have 100% component as internal evaluation at the institute level. All external courses will have 40% internal component and 60% external component [University] examination.

Internal and external heads of passing shall be separate head of passing. Internal evaluation shall consist of one project (20 marks) and minimum 2 of the following (10 marks each): Tutorial, case analysis, cases and open problems, essays, seminar presentations, vivavoce, quiz, drafting, moot court, mock trial, learning logs/diaries, computer based assessment, simulated interviews, objective structured clinical examinations.

- 12. STANDARD OF The assessment of students for each PASSING done, based on examination is relative performance. Maximum Grade Point (GP) is 4.000 corresponding to A+. For all courses, a student is required to pass both internal and examination separately external with а minimum Grade Point of 2.000 corresponding to Grade D. Students securing less than 40% absolute marks in each head of passing will be declared FAIL. The University awards a degree to the student who has achieved a minimum CGPA of 2.000 out of maximum of 4.000 for the program.
- 13. AWARD OF DEGREE Bachelor of Business Administration & Bachelor of Laws (BBALLB) degree will be awarded at the end of semester X by taking into consideration the performance of all semester examinations after obtaining minimum 2.000 CGPA out of 4.000.

⁴ This course will have three components: a. Moot Court (Three moot courts with 10 marks each= 30 marks); b. Observance of Trial in two cases, one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks); and c. Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and as per the given format, cumulative Internship diary (60 marks). Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in a separate diary. In addition to the above three components, the fourth component will be Viva Voce examination on all the above three aspects (30 marks). Vive voce examination will be conducted by a panel consisting of internal and external members (appointed by the Symbiosis International University).
